



Pottawattamie County is participating in a national legal settlement aimed at addressing the opioid epidemic, and Public Health is set to leverage these funds for targeted efforts within the county. To ensure the most effective use of these resources, Pottawattamie County Public Health is actively seeking input from the community to develop a comprehensive Community Opioid Action Plan. To facilitate this process, Parlay Consulting Firm is collaborating with various stakeholders, including hospitals, medical centers, nonprofits, law enforcement, government agencies, individuals with lived experience, and community members knowledgeable about substance misuse, including opioid use disorder. Their insights will be instrumental in shaping strategies to combat the opioid crisis and promote community well-being.

Please join us in a community conversation dedicated to sharing your insights and perspectives on opioid use in Pottawattamie County. Your input on prevention efforts, treatment continuum, and opportunities to support services will be invaluable to the action planning process.

Three sessions will be conducted in-person, while one session will be held virtually. Additionally, one session will be conducted in Spanish to ensure inclusivity and accessibility.
