

**JANUARY 2, 2019****MET IN REGULAR SESSION**

The Board of Supervisors met in regular session at 9:00 AM. All members present.

**2. SCHEDULED SESSIONS**

District Court Judge Maggie Popp Reyes appeared to swear in the following elected officials: Lea Voss, Treasurer; Scott A. Belt, Board of Supervisor; Justin Schultz, Board of Supervisor; Lynn Grobe, Board of Supervisor; Mark A. Brandenburg, Recorder. County Attorney Matt Wilber was not present, as he was out of town, but will be sworn in by Judge Reyes when he returns to the office.

Motion by Drake, second by Belt, to appoint Melvyn Houser, County Auditor, as Temporary Chairperson for the election of a new Board Chairman and Chairman Pro-Tem for the year 2019. UNANIMOUS VOTE. Motion carried.

Houser announced nominations are now in order for the office of Chairman for 2019.

Tim Wichman was nominated by Scott Belt.

There being no further nominations, Melvyn Houser, Temporary Chairman, declared it ceased. The Board proceeded to vote as follows:

Discussion was held with Jason Slack, Director of Buildings and Grounds, and other various Department Heads concerning the parking assignments for the vacated parking along the east alley inner radius vacated by the Council Bluffs Police Department. A Motion was made by Drake to assign Communications eleven parking spots, there was no second to the motion, and said Motion died. Chairman Wichman directed Slack to assign the parking spots at his discretion.

Motion by Belt, second by Schultz, to approve and authorize Board to sign **Resolution No. 06-2019**, entitled: Resolution Authorizing the County Engineer to Close Secondary Roads for Construction and/or Maintenance. Said Resolution is set out as follows:

**RESOLUTION NO. 06-2019**

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY ENGINEER TO CLOSE SECONDARY ROADS FOR CONSTRUCTION AND/OR MAINTENANCE.**

**WHEREAS**, Section 306.42 of the Code of Iowa, 2002, provides that “The agency having jurisdiction and control over any highway in the state, or the chief engineer of said agency when delegated by such agency, may temporarily close sections of a highway by formal resolution entered upon the minutes of such agency when reasonably necessary because of construction, reconstruction, maintenance, or natural disaster and shall cause to be erected ROAD CLOSED signs and partial or total barricades in the roadway at each end of the closed highway section and on the closed highway where that highway is intersected by other highways if such intersection remains open. Any numbered road closed over forty-eight hours shall have a designated detour route. The agency having jurisdiction over a section of highway closed in accordance with the provisions of this section, or the persons or contractors employed to carry out the construction, reconstruction, or maintenance of the closed section of highway, shall not be liable for any damages to any vehicle that enters the closed section of highway or the contents of such vehicle or for any injuries to any person that enters the closed section of highway, unless the damages are caused by gross negligence of the agency or contractor,”

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Pottawattamie County Board of Supervisors in session this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of January, 2019, that the County Engineer be authorized to close Pottawattamie County Secondary roads as necessary with the actual dates of closure to be determined by the County Engineer as follows:

For Construction: Any project as described in the approved “Pottawattamie County Secondary Road Construction Program for the fiscal year 2019-2020, and any approved supplements thereto.”

For Emergency Closure of any road for maintenance purposes: Any route deemed necessary by the County Engineer.

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Supervisors is empowered under authority of Section 321E.1 of the 2002 Code of Iowa to issue permits for the movement of machines, vehicles, or loads, or combinations thereof which exceed the maximum dimensions and/or weights specified in Sections 321.452 to 321.466 but within the limitations of Chapter 321E upon Secondary Roads under their jurisdiction, and

**WHEREAS**, it is important that such permits be issued by persons familiar with the statutes and regulations relating to such permits and also with the limitations of the County's roadways, road surfaces, and structures along the selected or designated routes,

**WHEREAS**, only counties that have adopted a construction evaluation resolution can submit to the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) an adopted recommendation to approve or disapprove a construction permit application regarding a proposed confinement feeding operation structure; and

**WHEREAS**, only counties that have adopted a construction evaluation resolution and submitted an adopted recommendation may contest the DNR’s decision regarding a specific application; and

**WHEREAS**, by adopting a construction evaluation resolution the Board of Supervisors agrees to evaluate every construction permit application for a proposed confinement feeding operation structure received by the Board of Supervisors between February 1, 2019, and January 31, 2020, and submit an adopted recommendation regarding that application to the DNR; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Supervisors must conduct an evaluation of every construction permit application using the master matrix as provided in Iowa Code Section 459.305, but the Board’s recommendation to the DNR may be based on the final score on the master matrix or may be based on reasons other than the final score on the master matrix:

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF POTTAWATTAMIE COUNTY, IOWA** that the Board of Supervisors hereby adopts this construction evaluation resolution pursuant to Iowa Code Section 459.304(3).
