Nick edlicka spent over five years serving as Platoon Sergeant and the Unit Readiness NCO for a 218 soldier infantry company. In 2012, he became the assistant operations NCO for an infantry brigade comprised of six battalions and more than 3,600 soldiers, as well

as the senior intelligence sergeant for an infantry brigade combat team managing the brigade's security, counterintelligence and imagery analysis missions. From October 2013 to May 2018, Jedlicka served as the battalion operations NCO responsible for providing tactical and technical guidance, and professional support to subordinate units. 
